

Benefits and Obligations

1. Opportunity to share **corporate identity** with the support of 50 years' experience in the development of the techniques that are currently being used throughout the world, which are supported by published material and research based upon these methods.
2. INPP or each National Principal can recommend a Licentiate to a potential client if requested. (This is not an automatic right).
3. **Licentiates' names are listed** on the INPP national websites. (If there is no national principal in the territory, practitioners may apply to be international Licentiates of INPP). This enables the public to see which practitioners adhere to Licentiate terms and conditions, code of ethics in the practice of the INPP method and attend regular continuing professional development (CPD/supervisions) in the method.
4. A Licentiate has **the right to use the INPP Licentiate logo** on all clinical materials pertaining to the INPP method. The logo is a registered trademark in the United Kingdom, Europe, USA, Mexico and Australia and may only be used with the permission of INPP.
5. INPP or the National Principals will provide **advice and support** to Licentiates in aspects of practice of the method if requested.
6. INPP offers update sessions in the form of **Supervision Days and/or The European/International Conferences** on aspects of the INPP method. Supervision is compulsory in the first 18 months after successfully completing the INPP practitioner course and constitutes the final phase of training as a practitioner of the INPP method.
7. Supervision days are open to all Licentiates in subsequent years. Licentiates are required to attend a minimum of 2 supervision days in

their territory or with a National Principal every 2 years to maintain the right to Licentiate membership - *See supervision guidelines document* -.

8. Licentiates have access to the INPP clinical database, enabling them to input (with the written consent of the client or client's legal guardian) data pertaining to developmental history and INPP assessment findings and to access clinical data to carry out research on aspects of the INPP method.
9. Licentiates must use the **standard colours and fonts** provided for all materials and information pertaining to the INPP method (eg. INPP sections of their websites). Licentiates have access to all standardised INPP clinical materials (Questionnaire, Assessment, Exercises etc.) provided through their national Principal and accessed on the INPP portal (only available in English where there is no National Principal).
10. **Licentiate membership** is renewed annually on the 1st June each year. Reminders will be sent at least 1 month prior to the renewal date. Renewal documents and payment must be received no later than the 31st May prior to the date of renewal for a Licentiate's name to be listed on the INPP national website for the following year and to maintain access to INPP portal.
11. All **INPP clinical and training materials are copyright to INPP** Ltd. The annual fee is the payment required for the right to reproduce copyright materials in clinical practice eg. INPP standard questionnaires, assessment pro-forma, report templates and exercise instructions. (This is different from training, in which knowledge and methodology are provided).
12. INPP National Principals have the right to **revoke Licentiate** if a member is deemed to have broken the contract previously entered into as a Licentiate of INPP.
13. Out of respect for colleagues, Licentiates are explicitly asked not to use domain names or email addresses that could lead to the interpretation that a certain Licentiate is "exclusive" to a geographic area or diagnosis (e.g. www.inpp.dislessia.nl , inpp-toscana@gmail.com or similar).

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
